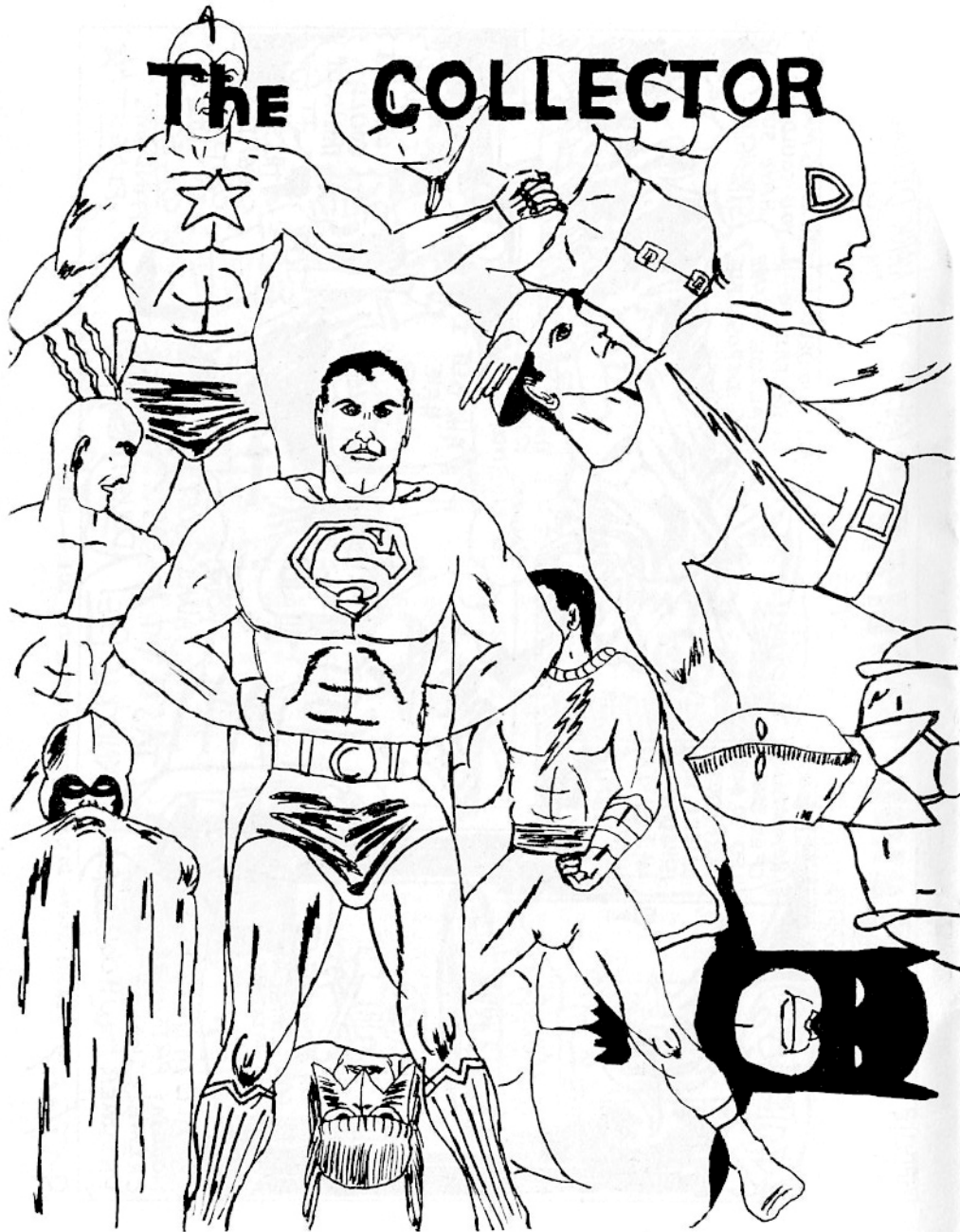

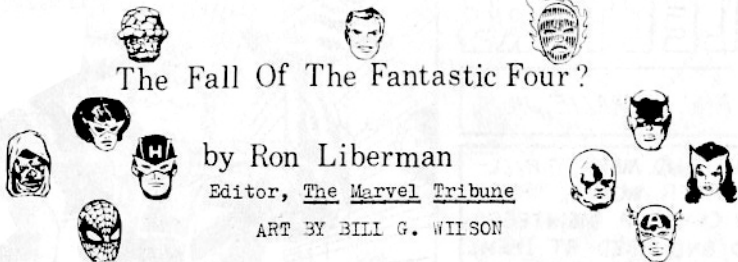

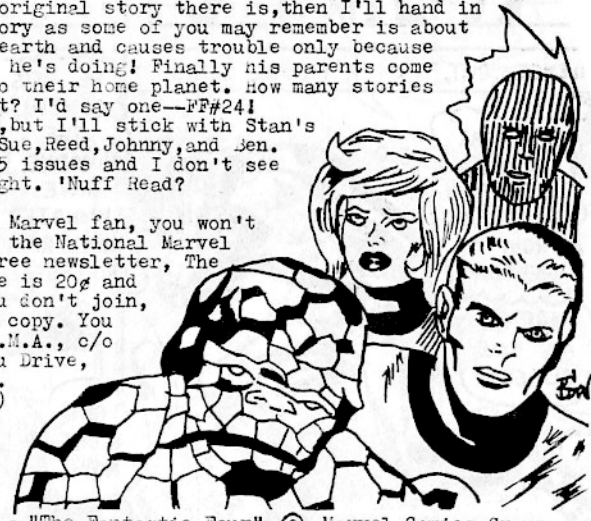
Stan Lee is considered by every Marvelite to be the best writer in the business, and by many DC and other brand fans also.
