

EDITORIAL

Well, I can finally say that FAN SPECTACULAR 1981 has finally arrived. I admit it took a little longer than originally expected (after all, the original title was FAN SPECTACULAR 1980), but I think it was well worth the wait, and I hope you all feel the same way.

Without exception, this has to be the longest stripzine I've published thus far, a whopping 44 pages!! When's the last time you read a story that long? Probably a while, I know it has been for me. That's one of the reasons I purposely made the story so long... I wanted a long story that you could really get into it, really deep into it. The fact is that I love epics, and

this was my first.

So what about the finished product? Well, of course \underline{I} like it, but more importantly, what do you think of it? I plan on producing a FAN SPECTACULAR every year (hence the $\overline{19}81$ in the title) on an annual basis, but it is also a possibility that Joey Manley and I may incorporate these characters into a sort of fandom "Justice Leaque" or "Avengers". If this happens, the stripzine will probably be published three or four times a year and will p obably consist of Willie Peppers doing the art. More on that thought later. But if we don't do that book, there will be a FAN SPECTACULAR 1982, but who will produce it, I don't know. I'd like to get different people doing the book each year (I've asked a ccuple people if they want to do 1982), but if I can't find anybody to do it next year, I probably will.

Now about the people involved. I, Matt Bucher, have written about 20 or so strips to date, mainly featuring my two prime characters, Omniman and Argon,

the space warrior.

Willie Peppers, the penciller of this entire book, is the most professional fan artist I have ever had the pleasure to work with--bar none. In most cases he is prompt with the best material whose quality cannot be matched. One interesting factor about this book is the fact that it should appeal to both DC and Marvel fans. After all, I'm primarily a DC fan and wrote this in DC style and form, but Willie Peppers is definitely a Marvel type artist. An interesting mix.

Bill Anderson inked more pages than anybody else, and has overall been the most involved person besides Willie and myself in this project. Bill's an

excellent inker, and it probably won't be long before he goes pro.

Mark Heike is another fantastic inker. Even though he's been tremendously busy lately, he still took the time out to ink a couple pages for me.

Rick McCollum is also a great artist. Mostly known for his HORDE work, Rick has built himself up a reputation of being one of fandom's finest artists. And last, but not least, is Ken Meyer, a semi-new inker with a lot of raw talent. This is the first time Ken's ever inked anybody besides himself, and I think he did a great job.

I guess now is as good a time as any to talk about whose characters are

whose. Here we go: 1) City-God: Filthy McNasty. City-God has appeared in his own fanzine put out by Nasty.

2) Xenogama & Intruder: Troy Waters. I believe this is their first appearance is a comic fanzine.

3) Cmniman, Rage, Space Warrior, Velocity: Myself. Omniman has appeared in many zines as has Space Warrior. Rage and Velocity both will be appearing in team-ups with Omniman in the near future.

4) Wizard Warrior, Renegade, Dynamic Dynamo: Bart Chumet. Their first time

in a fanzine.

5) Captain Cosmos: Easton Davy Jr. Captain Cosmos has appeared in various issues of No Sex.

6) Phazor: Eric Scalzi. Phazor had his own strip in some early Dynazine issues. ((an't)

7) Sky-Lark & Blue Streak: Steve Hahn. Blue Streak's first appearance here, Sky-Lark has appeared in his own zine from Steve.

8) Nightshadow: Jerry Foley. Nightshadow has appeared in his own fanzine

by Jerry.

9) Starflame: Mat & Jim Kramer. Starflame has also appeared in his own zine curtesy of Mat and Jim.

10) Seeker: John Zupkow. Seeker appeared in some prose stories in FANTASIA but this is his first time drawn.

11) Shotgun: Bill Anderson. This is Shotgun's premiere appearance, although he will appearing in a team up with Omniman soon by Bill Anderson.

12) The Ankh & Black Mercy: Ken Meyer. I think this may be their first appearance, but I'm not positive.

13) Slaughter: Rick McCollum. This is Slaughter's first appearance, although Rick McCollum will be putting out a zine with him in it very soon.

14) Power Pack: Joey Manley. Power Pack has appeared in Joey's own Comic* Strips zine (which is now cancelled).

15) Captain Gizmo: Dave Patterson. Captain Gizmo has appeared in various zines as a humorous character, although this is his first serious appearance.

Now about who did what. I (Matt Bucher) wrote the entire story, and Willie Peppers pencilled the entire thing. Inks were diverse, so here's a rundown:

Cover and backcover: Pencilled and inked by Willie Peppers.

Pages 1-8: Inked by Bill Anderson Pages 9-12: lnked by Rick McCollum

Pages 13-14: Inked by Mark Heike (lettered by Bill Anderson)

Pages 15-18: Inked by Bill Anderson

Pages 19-26: Inked by Rick McCollum Pages 27-29: Inked by Mark Heike (lettered by Bill Anderson)

Pages 30-33: Inked by Bill Anderson Pages 34-44: Inked by Ken Meyer Jr.

And there you go, a total list of who did what. As of this date (3/8/81) I still need four pages from Rick McCollum and eleven from Ken Meyer. As soon as those are in, the book will be published.

and a Nimrod story by Manley/Nasty.


